For many people, it's the first part, swimming, that they're most worried about. It's often in a lake or the sea, so, even if you get tired, you can't put your feet down for a rest. Also, you have to lift your arms up high because the water moves up and down. It's a good idea to practise this, even when you're in the swimming pool.



This is the second part of the triathlon. Riding a bike with a lot of other people can be strange at first, so practise with friends. Remember that, in the race, you have to stay away from the other bikes because it's dangerous to get too close.
