WHERE ARE THEY NOW?

Twenty years ago, Pia Leon was one of the most famous rock singers in the world. Everyone wanted to hear her amazing voice, and she sang for kings, queens and presidents. So why has the world forgotten her now?





So can you expect to live to be a hundred years old? Well, there are big differences between areas of the UK. The healthiest place to live is East Dorset, in the south of England, where men live to nearly seventynine years, and women to over eighty-six years. But in Blackpool and Manchester – cities in the north of England – it's not such good news. Most men in Blackpool don't live to seventy-four, and women in Manchester die seven years before women in East

If you really want to live to a hundred, the best thing to do is move to Japan, which has the highest number of old people in the world.
