

But one way people spend their free time in Britain isn't on the list. It's watching TV. Perhaps that is because people do it so often they don't think it's a hobby!









THE INTERNATIONAL YOUTH ARTS FESTIVAL

■or 10 days every July, → hundreds of young people from Britain and around the world come to Kingston upon Thames in south-west London, to act, dance, play or sing at the International Youth Arts Festival. With over 200 things to see and do, it is an important festival of art, music, theatre and dance for young people in the world.

Theatre is usually a part of the festival. Acting groups with young people from

five to 26 years old put on plays and shows for children, teenagers and adults. Some of them are famous, like the plays of writers like William Shakespeare and some of them are very funny.

Music is a big part of the festival. Each year, there are pop, rock and hip hop concerts, with both new and well-known musicians. Do you sing or play an instrument? Why not enter the music competition?

'Workshops' are a very important part of the festival. Workshops are similar to lessons, for students to learn how to sing, dance, rap, write plays, or make clothes, not to learn maths or science. Many young people don't have the possibility to learn about music, theatre and dance because private lessons are very expensive. But workshops are a great way for them to discover the things they like and what they are good at. And perhaps their future is to be singers, dancers or actors at this amazing festival.

he most popular videos on websites like YouTube are often music videos. But sometimes. more unusual videos can 'trend' or become very popular for a short time. But with 300 hours of video out on YouTube every minute, how does a video become popular?

In February 2011, a 13-year-old American student, Rebecca Black, uploaded a video to YouTube of her singing a song called Friday. To begin with, the video wasn't very popular and only 1,000 people watched it in the first month. But on 11th March, something changed, and suddenly millions of people were watching it. But what happened?

Videos become popular after people share them on social networking sites. The main reason people share

videos is because they are funny or strange. Lots of people thought Friday was both. Some people thought the video was terrible. some didn't like the song, and some thought Rebecca couldn't sing. One famous comedian said it was the worst video ever.

But a lot of other people loved it and made their own funny videos with songs about every other day of the week, which they put on YouTube as well. Soon millions of people were chatting and watching videos about it online. Finally, pop stars like Katy Perry and Justin Bieber were singing her song at their concerts, and Rebecca was in newspaper articles and on TV programmes all over the world. All because people thought a pop video was funny.

THE DAILY MILE

What exercise have you done this week? How did you feel afterwards? How would you feel about running for 15 minutes every day? More and more schools in the UK have started to think that it is a good idea and have a 15-minute run for every student into the school day.

It's called the Daily Mile. (A mile is about 1.6 kilometres.) It started at a primary school in Stirling, Scotland in 2012, and very quickly the teachers saw some important changes. They said that the students were happier and less tired during the day. Because of this, they worked better in class. The teachers were really surprised that the children enjoyed doing the run, even when the weather was bad. The children's parents were also happy with what they saw. They said that running every day helped the children to sleep better. But most importantly, they became healthier and none of the children in the school were overweight.

They think that it could help everyone get more interested in sport and do better at school and stop young people from becoming overweight. 





There are so many things that you can do to earn some extra cash. And if your idea is good, you may be able to make a lot of money. That's what Leanna Archer did.

Leanna was only nine when she had the idea for her business, and it all started with hair. Leanna lives in New York, but her great-grandmother is from Haiti in the Caribbean. She often made her own shampoos which she sent to Leanna. Leanna gave some of the things that her greatgrandmother made to her friends and everyone liked them. At first, she didn't think they were something she could earn money from. But soon lots of people started coming to Leanna's house

When Leanna was 11 or 12, a local newspaper wrote an article about her great-grandmother's shampoos and more people became interested in them. It was then that she decided to start a real business. She asked her dad to help her with the business and her great-grandmother to help her make the shampoos and soon she was selling them online to customers in the USA and around the world.

But she didn't stop there. When she was 13, she visited Haiti for the first time. She saw how poor some of the people were there and decided she wanted to help. She used money from her business to start the Leanna Archer Education Foundation. It helps more than 200 poor children go to school.

It's amazing to think about everything that Leanna Archer did before she left school. And it will be interesting to see what she will do with the rest of her life.
