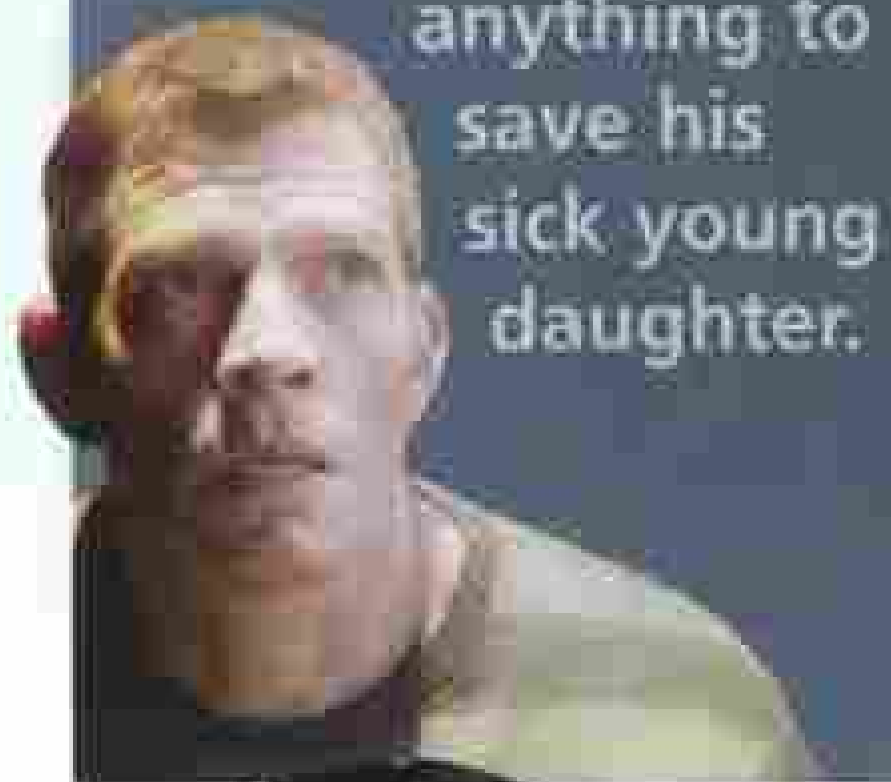


Aunt May is like a mother to Peter. Her husband, Uncle Ben, was murdered two years ago by a New York criminal. She lives alone and misses her husband very much.

Gwen Stacy studies science at university with Peter and works as a model.



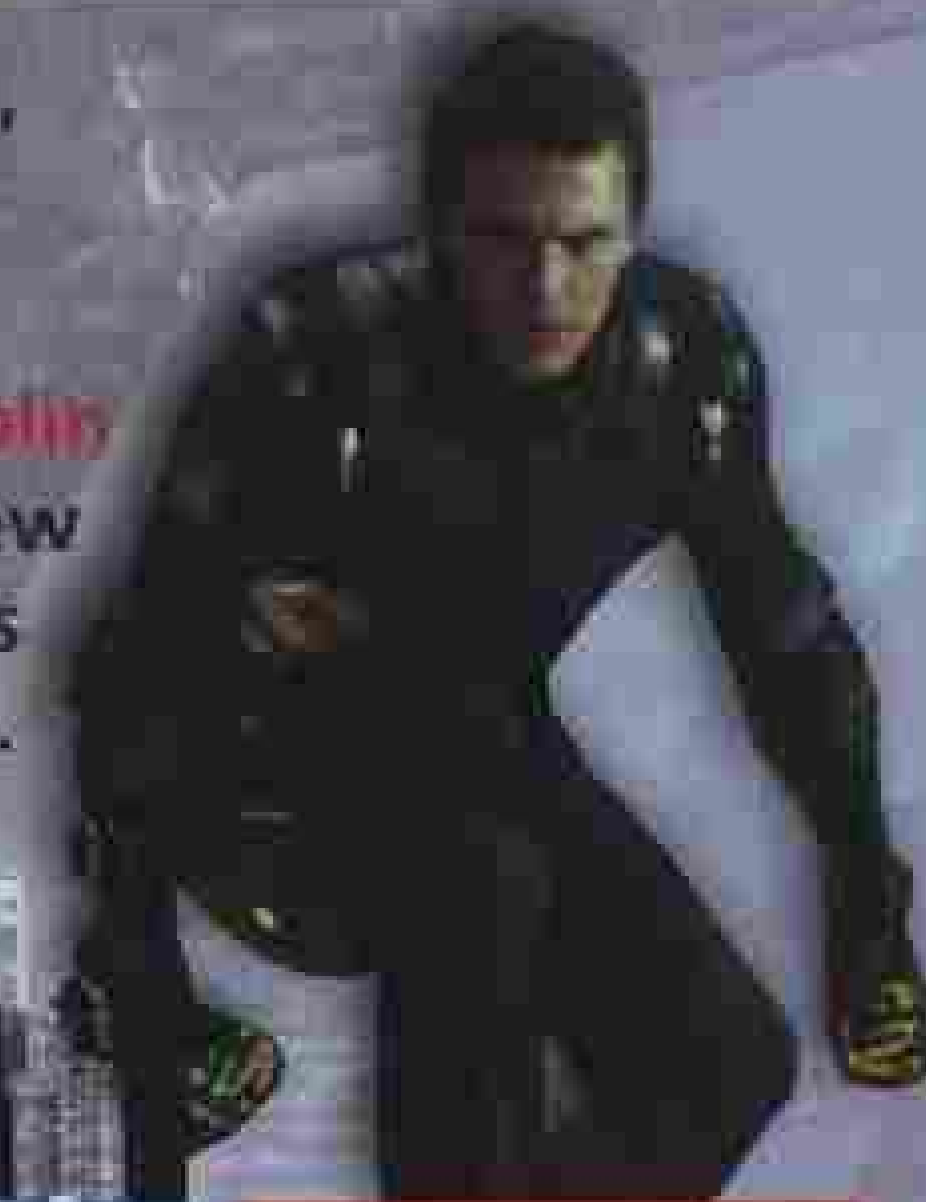
Eddie Brock is another photographer for the *Daily Bugle*. He thinks Gwen Stacy is his girlfriend.

Chapter 1 'Manhattan Memories'

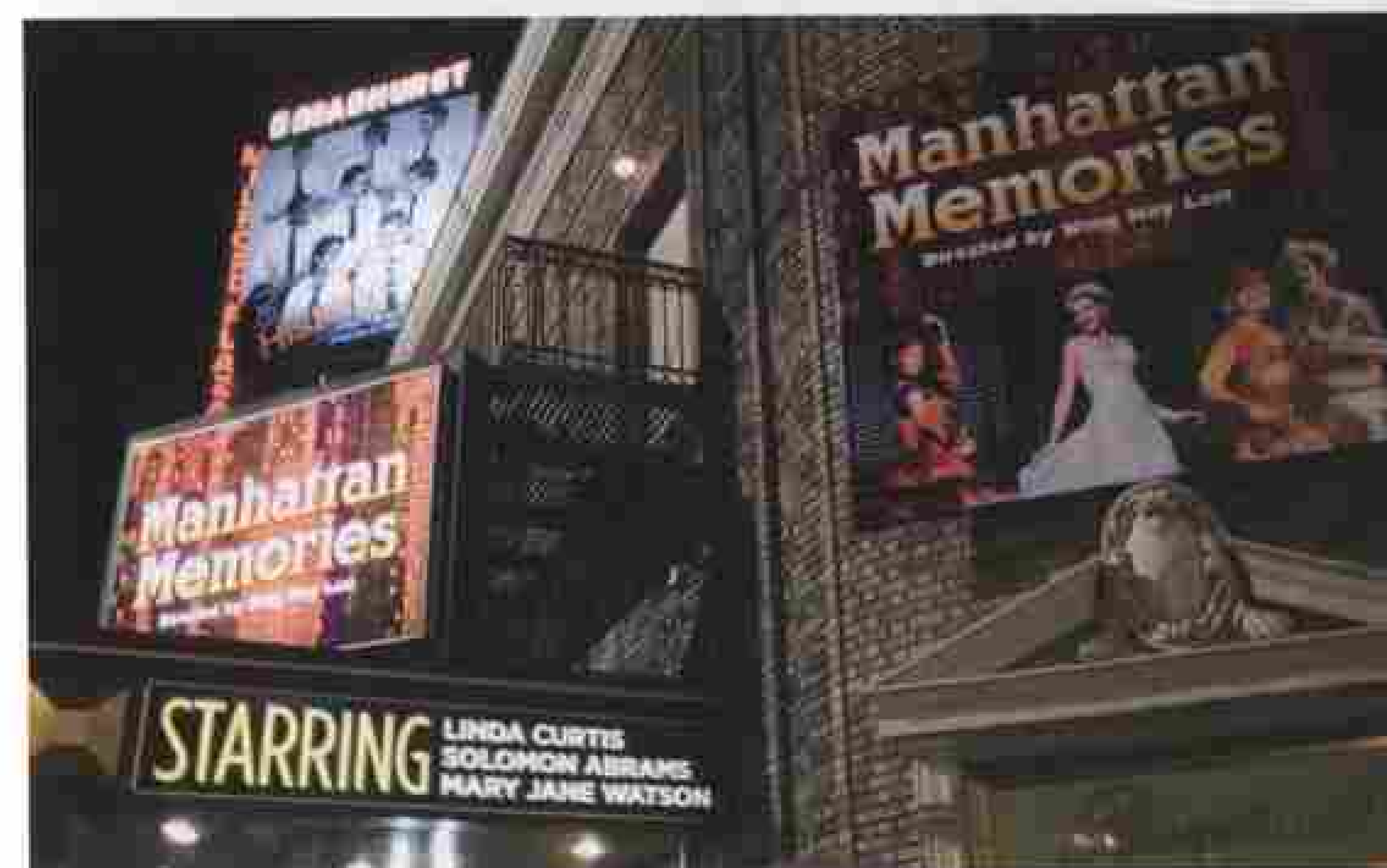

Peter was always late with the money for his room. Usually Peter was polite to Mr Ditkovich, but not today.

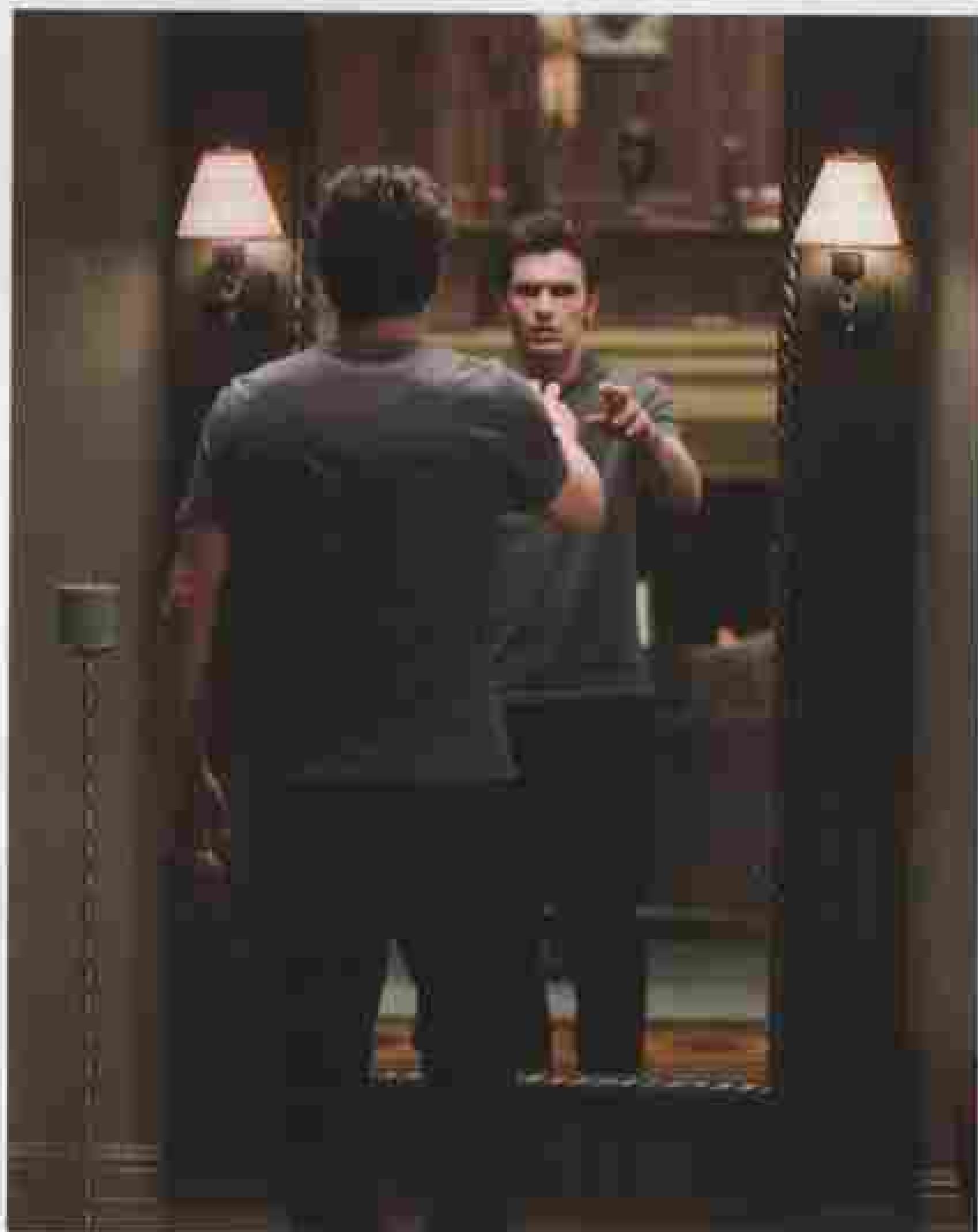
'I would pay on time if you mended anything. Like the lock on my door!' he shouted. He had the suit on under his clothes; he felt really powerful.

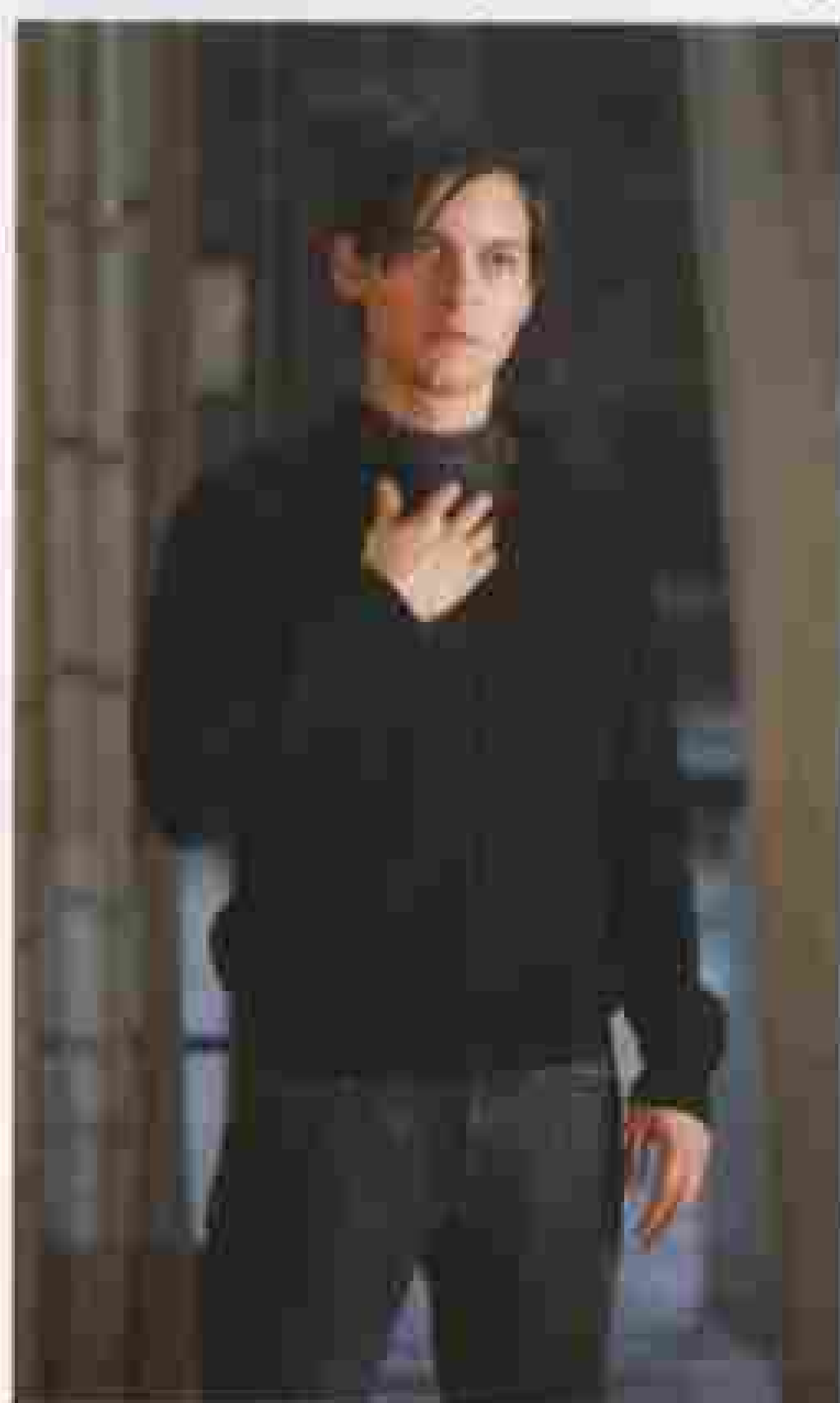
Peter let go of Eddie and gave a photo to Robbie. It was

How did they choose the villains for *Spider-Man 3*?

Venom is really popular with Spider-Man fans so he had to be in it! Sam Raimi and Tobey Maguire both love Sandman and wanted him in the film. He's an



unusual villain. He doesn't want to rule the world. He just wants to help his sick daughter.



And Harry Osborn is the New Goblin?

He is, but he's not very good at being a villain. He has too many difficult feelings. He wants revenge for his father's death, but he still loves his old friend Peter. And he still loves Mary Jane. He's not a strong character like his father, so he can't be a strong villain.

The Film

Is Peter any different in this story?

Peter is still 'just an average guy', as Spider-Man creator Stan Lee calls him. But he's really tested this time. There are questions about his feelings and his mind. 'Peter has to deal with his dark side,' said Avi Arad, one of the film's producers.

Why is the colour black important in this film?

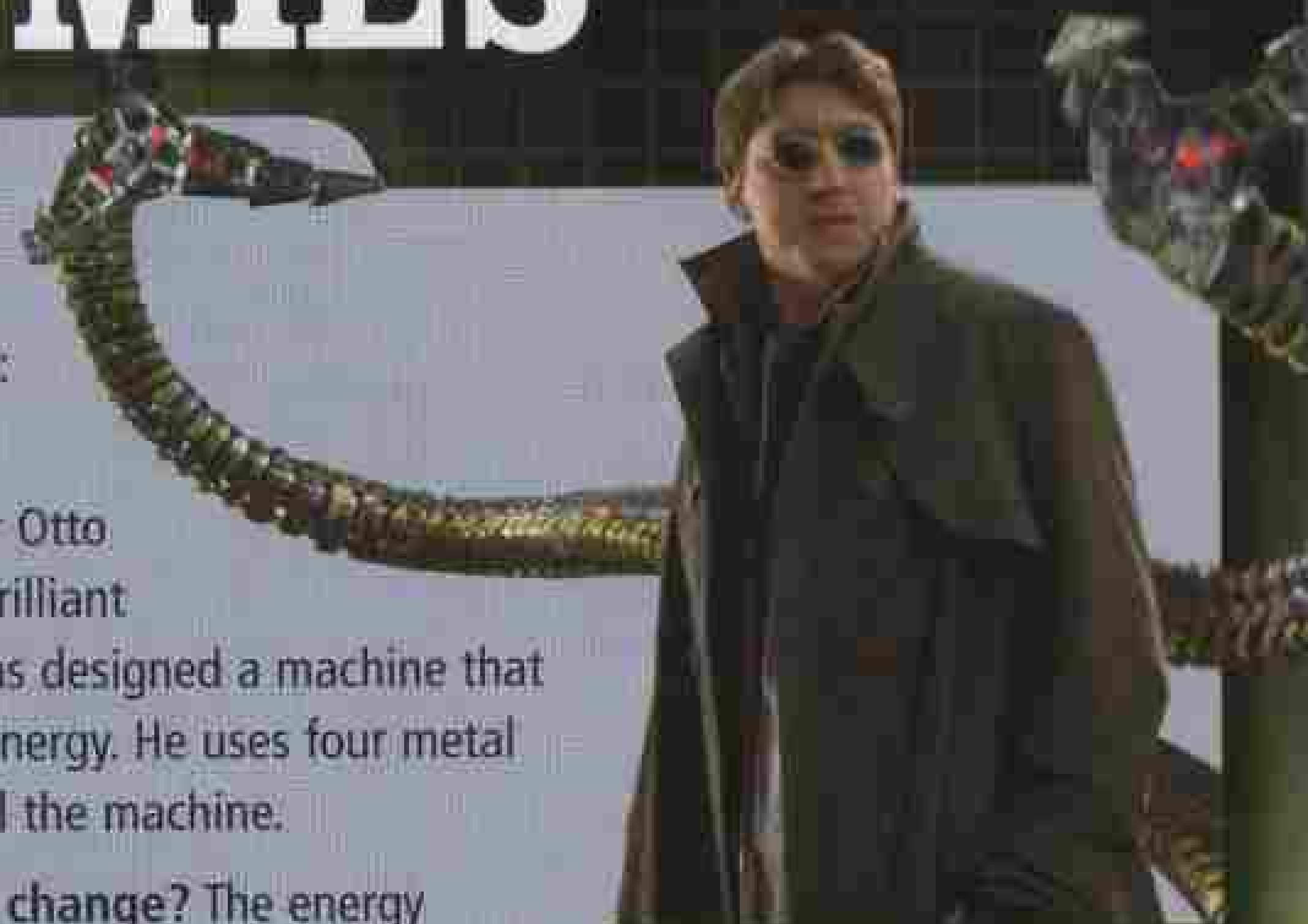
Doc Ock

The Street of Dreams

Broadway is one of the most famous streets in New York. It is also the most famous theatre area in the world. Many young actors dream of starring in one of its shows.



Did you know ...?

■ There are 39 Broadway theatres (these are theatres with more than 500 seats). Most of them were built between 1910 and 1930

■ Off-Broadway describes smaller theatres with between 100 and 499 seats.

■ Some of these theatres are on Broadway; others are in streets around Broadway.



■ The longest running Broadway show is 'The Phantom of the Opera', a musical which opened in January 1988.

■ The longest running Off-Broadway show is 'The Fantasticks', a

play at the very small Sullivan Street Playhouse. It started in May 1960 and continues today.

■ You can buy tickets for Broadway shows from the famous TKTs (tickets) box. People queue for half-price tickets from early each morning.

That's show business!

When a new Broadway show opens, the producer doesn't know when it will close. Success depends on three things:

- what the reviews say
- what people tell their friends
- good advertising

Mary Jane loses her job in 'Manhattan Memories' because of bad reviews. If people hear that the star is no good, the



show will flop. So the producer changes the star. It's hard, but that's show business!

The Great White Way

Broadway started as a Native American trail called the Wickquasgeck Trail. It went across Manhattan Island from north to south. When the Dutch came to this area, they used the trail and made it into a road. They called it *Breede weg* - the 'broad' (meaning 'wide') way. The British renamed it Broadway.



In 1880 Broadway became the first street in the USA to have electric street lights. In 1902 a newspaper called it the Great White Way because of all the lights along it. Some people still call it this name today.
